




Asian Student Demographics

- 11.3% of Elementary School Students are Asian.
- 11.5% of Middle School Students are Asian.
- 12.7% of High School Students are Asian.
- 36.5% of Asian students attend schools in which the majority of students are eligible for free and reduced price meals.
- 21.2% of Asian students attend schools in which 1/3 or more of students are English Language Learners.
- 15.6% of Asian students attend Program Improvement (PI) schools.
- 26.7% of Asian students attend high schools designated overcrowded by the state.

The educational opportunities of California students are correlated to their race and ethnicity. This fact sheet provides a glimpse at some key demographics regarding California's Asian students.* Other fact sheets provide similar data for California's African American, Latino,


California Asian Students and Their Schools

Asian Student California School Enrollment

- Schools with qualified teacher shortages enroll 1.9% of all Asian students.
- Schools with college preparatory course shortages enroll 47.4% of all Asian high school students.

The chart above shows the progress of California's Asian students in the Class of 2007. All of the bars represent a percentage of the Asian 9th graders enrolled in fall 2003. The 10th, 11th, and 12th Grade bars show that the size of the class shrinks each year. Grads 2007 and A-G Grads show how many Asian students graduated and how many passed the A-G courses required for admission to a California State University or University of California campus. The final three bars show what proportion of the Asian 9th graders enrolled in a California Community College, California State University, or University of California campus in fall 2007.
